

it has received from him an assurance that Her Majesty's Government is anxious to take such action as may be within its power to secure the objects aimed at.

In concluding this Report your Committee has pleasure in stating that its number has been reinforced by Mr. John Albert Bright, M.P., and the Rev. Dr. Mathews. The income of the Society during the year ending March 1891 was £379 17s., and its expenditure £392 16s. 5d. To an appeal for increased support which was issued last January generous response has been made by many friends; but the Committee still hopes for such an enlargement of income as will enable it both to continue efficiently the labours in which it is now engaged, largely carried on by gratuitous service, and to extend them in directions where they are urgently required.
